

Guide for authors

The article must be written in MS Word, max - 6 pages (up to 15 000 characters). Pages should not be numbered.

Single-column format. The maximum simple layout of the text, use the font Times New Roman - 10 pins. Line spacing is 12 pt. Use the selection in bold, italics, indexes, labels, etc.

When preparing tables, it is allowed to use one grid for each table, not a grid for each row. Figures and tables (not editable) must be done in English! All elements that can not be edited should not contain Cyrillic! (screen shots are not allowed).

Figures must be submitted by separate files, their placement in the text itself must be accompanied by signatures. It is recommended to use the spelling and grammar checking functions, and other means for verifying the text.

Structure of the article.

Division into sections and subsections.

Divide your article into clearly defined and numbered sections.

Subsections should be numbered 1.1 (then 1.1.1, 1.1.2, ...), 1.2, etc. (the abstract is not included in the overall numbering of sections). Use this numbering also for an internal cross-reference: do not just refer to "text", but to a specific section (subsection) in the text. In any subsection, a short title can be specified. Each title should start on a separate line.

1. Title page:

- Conference title The Thirteen International Conference "Organization and Traffic Safety Management in Large cities", Saint Petersburg, 27-29 September 2018 (Times New Roman, 17 font size),
- • Title of the article (in Russian and English), brief and informative. Headings are often used in information retrieval systems. Avoid abbreviations and formulas where possible.
- • Names and Surnames of all authors of the article (in Russian and English) indicating the correct affiliation (Times New Roman 11. Indicate the author, the host of the correspondence and his contact details *),
- • Affiliations. Specify the full postal address and full name of each organization, including the country and, if possible, the e-mail address of each author. (the indexing of the article in Scopus is carried out according to the authors' affiliation!)

Example:

Abstract (Times New Roman 9, interval 1.1, 200-300 words),

The abstract is not related to the main text and is presented separately in the scientific citation database, therefore it is necessary to avoid references to the text of the article. In addition, non-standard or unusual abbreviations should be avoided here, but if necessary they should be identified at their first mention in the paragraph itself.

• **Keywords** (maximum of 6 words).

2. Introduction: Explain the background of the work, the practical application, the nature and purpose of the study.

3. Material and methods

Provide sufficient detail to reproduce the study. Already published methods should be indicated by reference: only relevant changes should be described.

4. The main text: should contain a primary message, with a sequential presentation of thoughts and confirmation of the described methods.

5. Theory / calculation

The section "Theory" should expand, and not repeat the prehistory of the article already considered in the introduction, and lay the foundation for further work. On the contrary, the section "Calculation" is a practical development based on a theoretical basis.

• **Tables.** Tables should be numbered with Arabic numerals. The name of the tables must be up to the table, aligned to the left. Leave 1 line between the table name and the table itself. Tables should be in the text after the first mention. Refer to the table in the text - (table 1,2)

• **Figures.** All figures must be numbered with Arabic numerals. All the photographs, diagrams, graphs and diagrams refer to the figures. In the text, mention how (Figure 1, 2, 3 ...). Scans with poor picture quality are not accepted. Figures should be placed at the beginning or bottom of the page to a maximum close to the first mention of them. The figure caption and its number should be under the figure with the left alignment.

• **Formulas:** they must be typed in Mathtype. Leave blank 1 line before and 1 line after the formula. Number in chronological order Arabic numerals with right alignment:

$$\sigma_c = \frac{\pi^2 \cdot E_p(\sigma_c)}{\lambda^2} \quad (1)$$

Apps

If there is more than one application, they should be identified as A, B, etc.

Formulas and equations in applications should be given a separate numbering: Equation (A.1), equation (A.2), etc. D; in the following annex, equation (B.1) and so on. Similarly for tables and figures: table A.1; Figure A.1, etc.

ALL FIGURES, GRAPHICS, APPLICATIONS SEND SEPARATE FILE TOGETHER WITH THE TEXT OF THE ARTICLE.

ATTENTION!!! FIGURES, TABLES AND OTHER NON-EDITABLE ELEMENTS SHOULD ALSO BE SENT IN ALSO IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE.

7. Results

The results should be clear and concise.

8. Discussion

This section should investigate the significance of the results of the work, and not repeat them. The combined section "Results and discussion" often comes up. Avoid detailed quotes and discussions of published literature.

9. Conclusions

The main findings of the study can be presented in a short section "Conclusions", which can stand alone or be a subsection of the "Discussion" or "Results and Discussion" section.

10. Gratitude (if relevant)

11. References: in the text of the link should be at the end of the sentence in parentheses indicate the author's name and year of publication after the comma: for example, (Morozov 2015, Ballon 2016). If there are several authors, they are listed first in alphabetical order, then in chronological order.

All references that are directly mentioned in the text should be included in the list of used literature (and vice versa). Any references in the article should be given in full. Please note that the wrong surnames, journal / book titles, year of publication and pagination may prevent the creation of links in the citation databases of Scopus, Web of Science, etc. Links that have a DOI should be specified.

Web Links

At a minimum, the full URL and date of reference to the link must be specified. You should also specify any additional information if it is known (DOI, author names, dates, reference to the original publication, etc.). Web links can be listed separately (for example, after the bibliography) under a different heading, if necessary, or can be included in the bibliography.
